Principal's Message

A reminder that we are currently still on level 3 restrictions in schools which means teachers are wearing masks inside and students are encouraged to do so too. Students need a drink bottle every day as we are still unable to use bubblers. We still have our staggered break times and minimal mixing of cohorts as well. Many thanks to our school community for supporting our pickup routines which remain the same. We will let you know if there are any changes.

Please remember non-essential visitors are not permitted in schools. Some visitors are permitted in schools based on the guidelines that follow:

- Parents and carers must follow their school's advice regarding changes to drop off and pick up including staying in the car when dropping off and picking up children if safe to do so.
- Parents should maintain physical distancing by avoiding gathering outside of school gates.
- Parents need to remain outside of school grounds (note some exceptions may apply regarding schools for specific purposes,

follow mask-wearing requirements and sign in using the Service NSW QR code when entering the school. Please ring the office first if you need

to visit the school office.
